

CPTP INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY POLICY

Given the public nature of CPTP, it aims to promote a wide and accessible distribution of knowledge through the use of its resource. Therefore, Approved Users and their Approved Institutions agree not to make intellectual property claims on CPTP Research Data and/or Biosamples, but may choose to obtain intellectual property rights on subsequent innovations and downstream discoveries arising from such research data and/or biosamples. In other words, Approved Users will only own the results of their research.

Approved Users are strongly encouraged to follow the *Guidelines for the Licensing of Genetic Inventions* (<http://www.oecd.org/dataoecd/39/38/36198812.pdf>) adopted by the Organization for Economic Co-Operation and Development (OECD). Approved Users are expected to implement licensing policies that do not impede further research.
